
Oral Health Status:

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Score 1-Preventive Care-There are no visual signs of problems with the teeth or gums

Score 2-Restorative Care-Decayed teeth; Moderate signs or symptoms of gum infection (4 or less cavities)

Score 3-Urgent Treatment-Advanced dental disease including signs of pain and infection (5 or more cavities)



Patient Satisfaction Scores


Age 10 and Under


Age 11 and up

Lessons Learned

- Community Support
- Start small, and build on success
- Collaborate with local dentists and schools
- Portable and Dental together in the schools.
 - MHCA I estimate 75-85% of mobile dental programs do NOT provide restorative services
- Dental report cards to the schools
- The need is increasing
 - Decide the scope of your program
 - Tough Decisions must be made
 - "Healthy Communities" or "Revenue Based" Model?
 - Reduced Restorative from 9 counties to 7 counties last year
 - Do we need to reduce again?
- Dentist Recruitment and Sustainment is HARD!
- Dentists are trained differently than Doctors
 - Reporting Structures (management practices)
 - Training required when you hire new graduates
- Funding for Adults is almost nonexistant

Biggest Unmet Community Need

Adult Dentistry for low income families.

Sustainment Ideas

- Partnering with a local private practice dentist
- He hires and oversees dentists
- SBL assists with recruitment efforts / costs / sign-on bonuses
- SBL requests a specific number of hours to be covered by dentists.
- SBL pays hourly or daily rate to partnering dentist who then pays his staff.
- Best of both worlds for dentists
 - Private Practice experience / training
 - Get to do some of the "exciting" dentistry
 - Public Aid Service
- Better sustainment of program with multiple dentists
