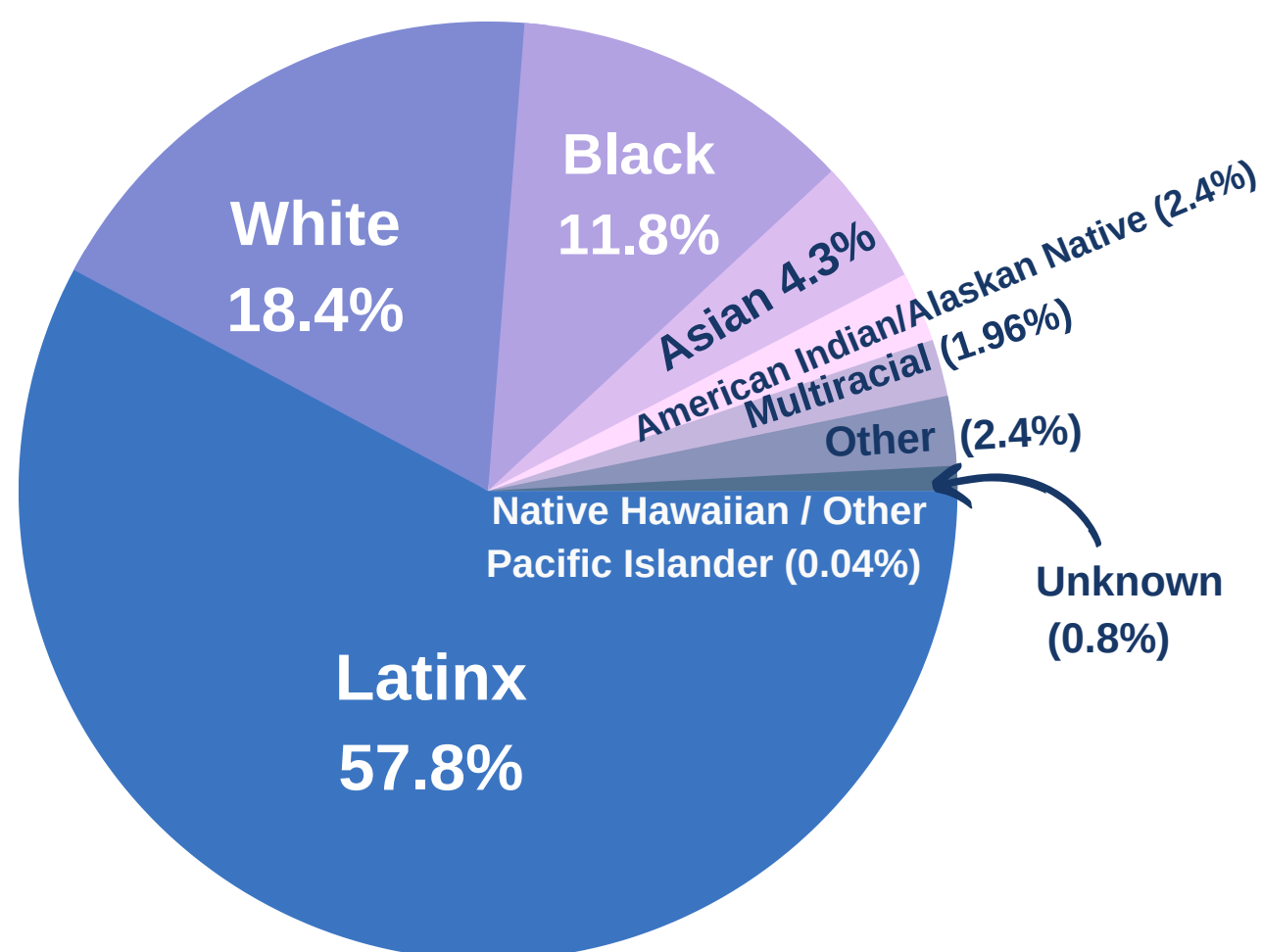

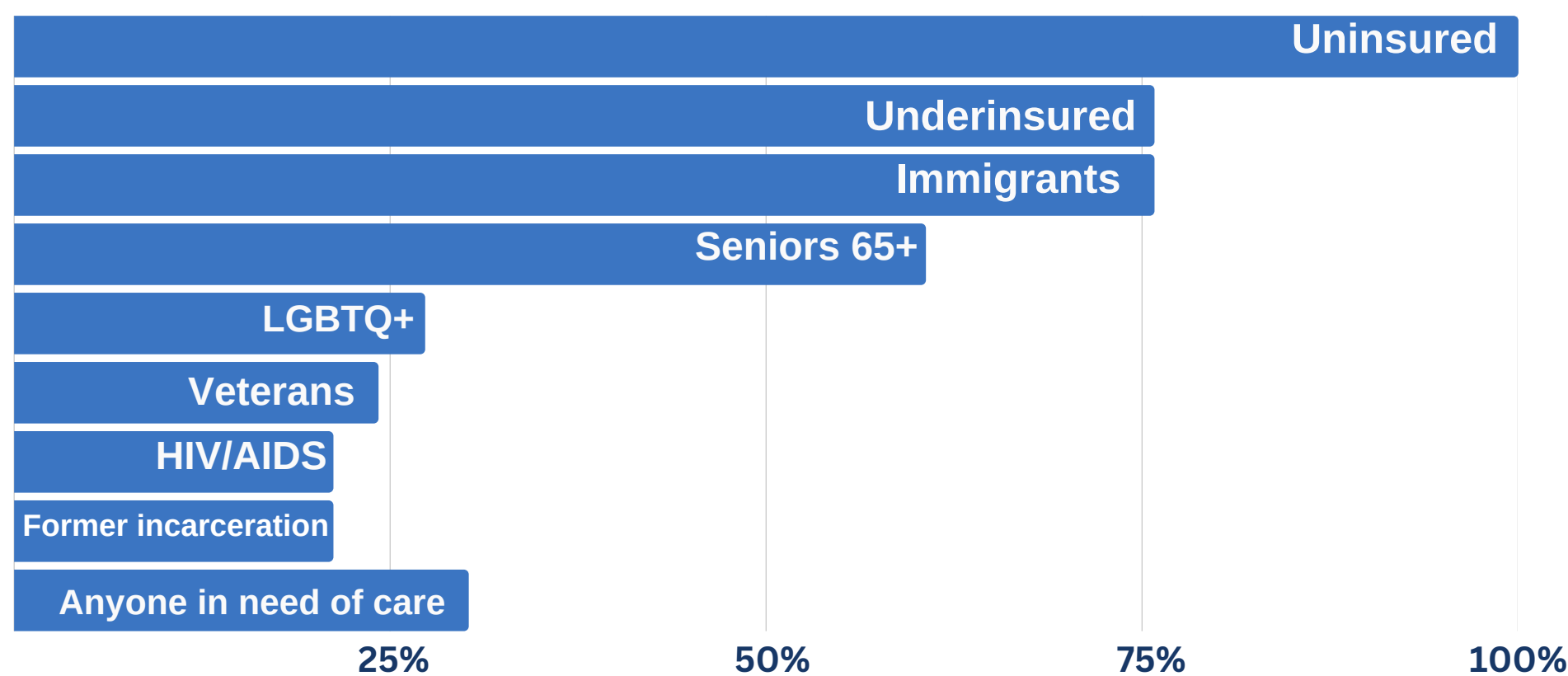


Who are the providers?

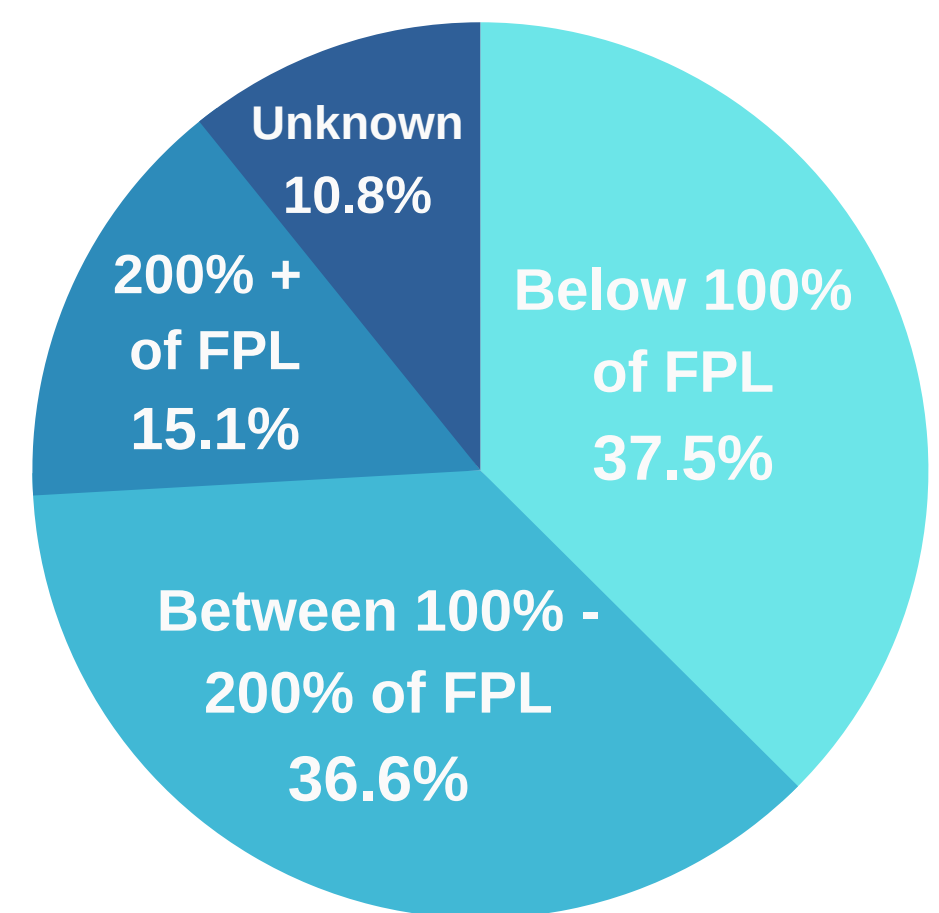
Populations Served at IAFCC Clinics
