All FCC patients live at or below **300% of Federal Poverty Level** (\$40,770 for a single individual), but more than 1 out of 3 (37.%) live below FPL (\$13,590).



\$33 MILLION

Illinois FCCs save hospitals more than \$33 million in emergency department diversions through acute care and chronic disease management.

1 in 4 FCC patients say they would go to the ED if their clinic was not available. More than half say that they wouldn't know where to go or would avoid seeking care at all.
